Pirates in Action

Twelve determined boys, nine seniors and three juniors, comprised this year's undefeated team compiling a 17-0 record in regular season play. For the first time, they won the Twin Lakes Conference the second year in a row as well as winning the sectional title. They incurred their only loss in the first round of districts.

The Pirates outscored their opponents 1,544 to 1,104 and outrebounded them 759 to 566. Their 79 point per game average was the best offensively in the conference. Defensively, TR placed second, holding their opponents to 54.5 points per game.





Individually, five Seniors led the Pirates. Greg Lemple scored 316 points for 48% shooting and grabbed 245 rebounds. Rich Kineth maintained a 49% shooting average, scoring 380 points and is credited with 87 assists. Virg Hacker connected on 50% of his shots for 225 points. Ron Hankins scored 118 points for a 44% average. Terry Johnson's 54% shooting and 303 points round out the bulk of TR's seasons point total. The other team members as well contributed to the team's success.

Three juniors will return next year to comprise the nucleus of the varsity team. Assisting these boys will be member of this year's successful junior varsity team. Hopefully, the desire to win displayed by this year's team will be carried over and maintained in the coming year.

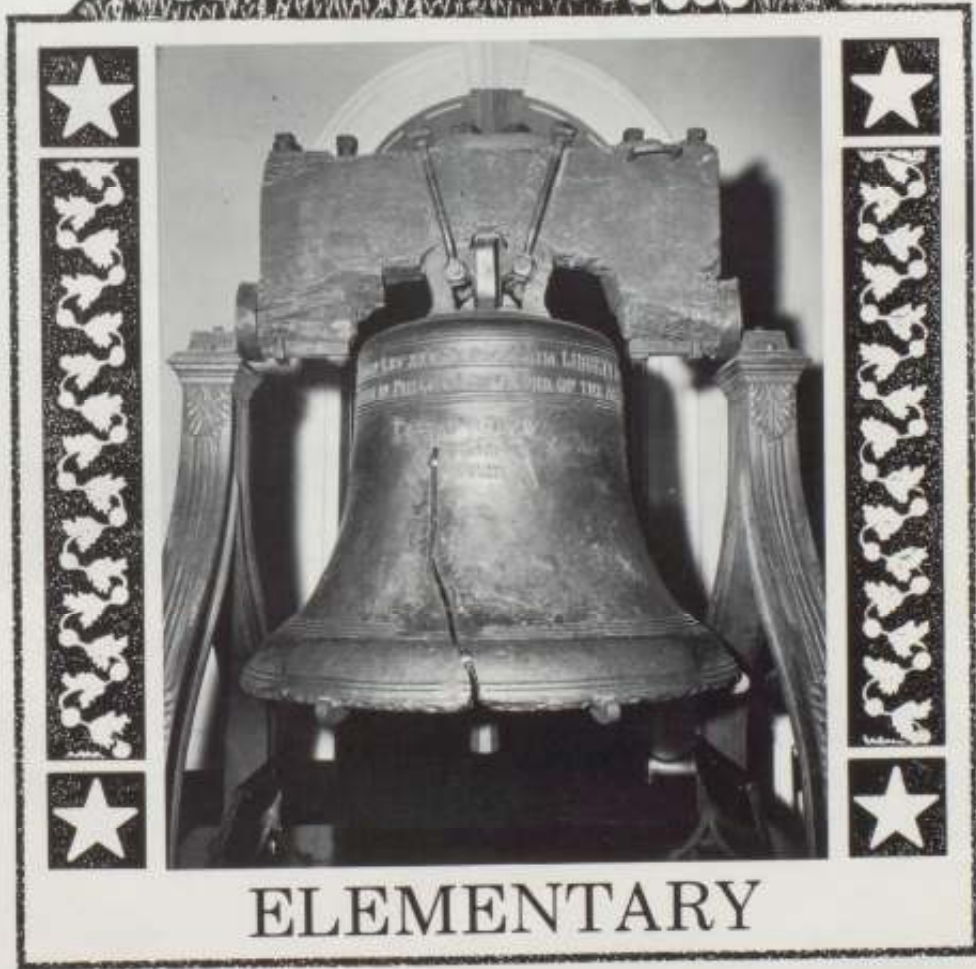


Jr. High Band and Vocal
