Talented and Gifted

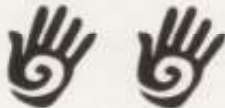

The squad was invited to perform at the Girls State Basketball Tournament in March. The drill team ended the season with the tenth annual Drill Team Night.

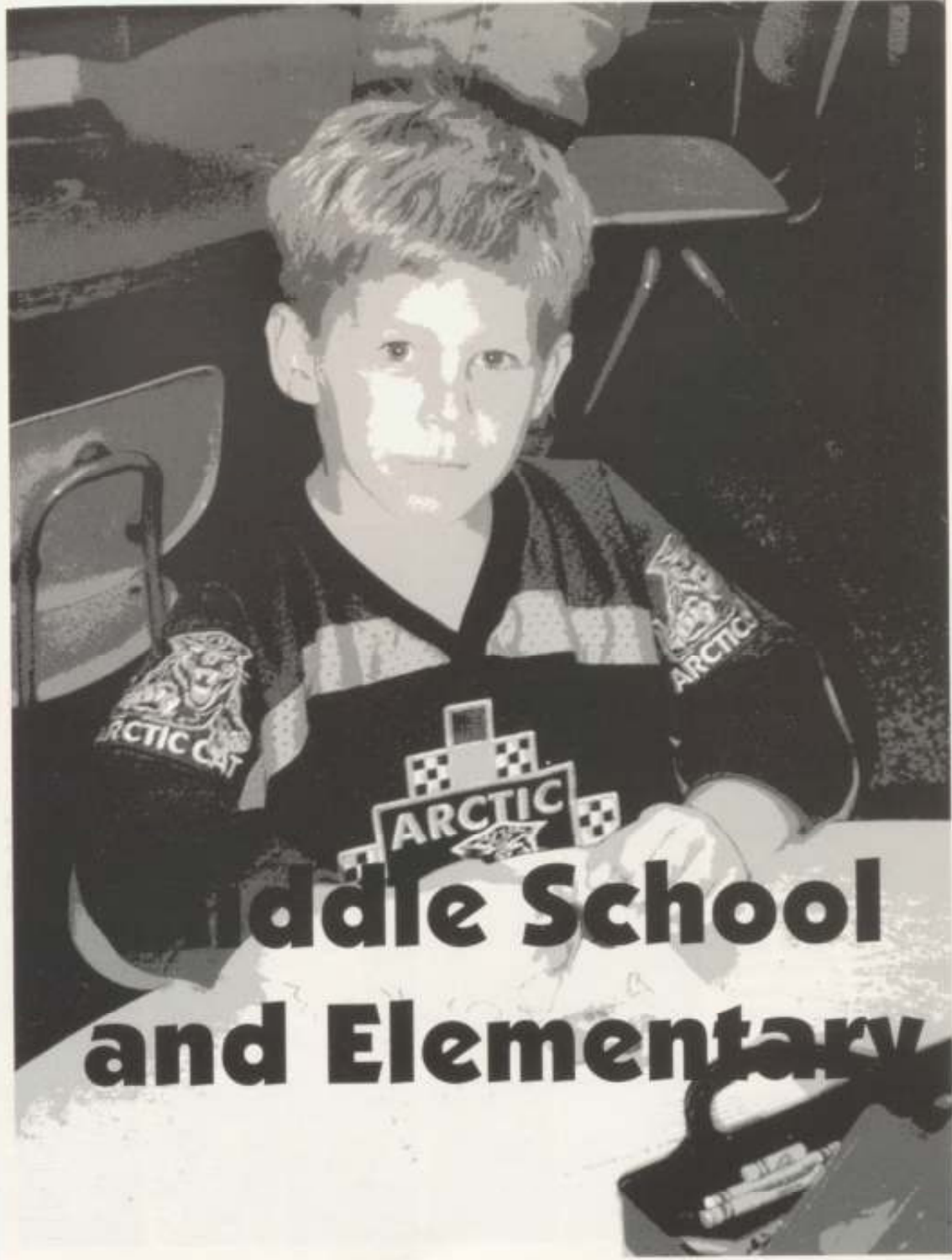
