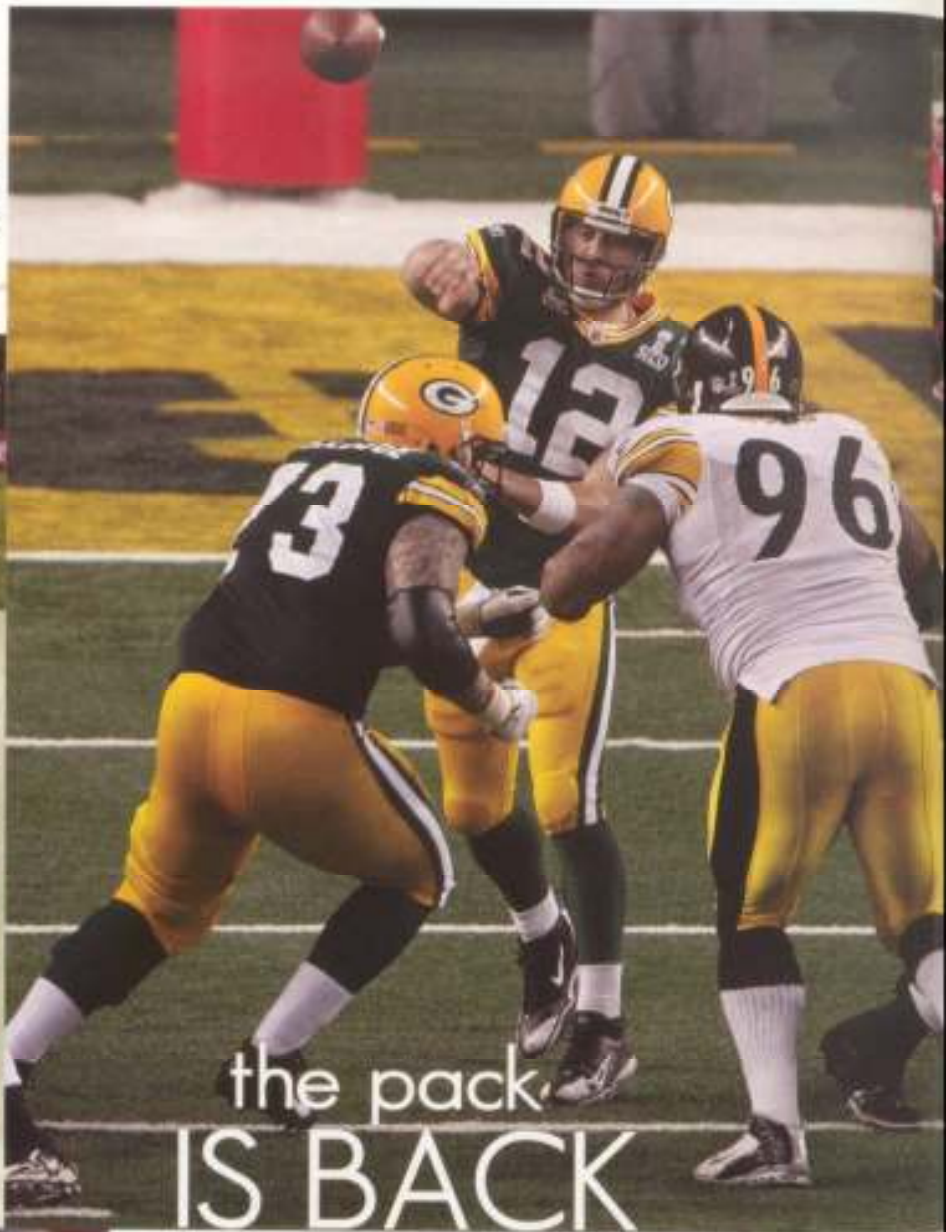


THIS EAGLE SOARS

RETURN TO TITLETOWN

Rodgers threw for 303 yards and three touchdowns in the game that drew more than 110 million viewers, making it the most-watched TV program in U.S. history.

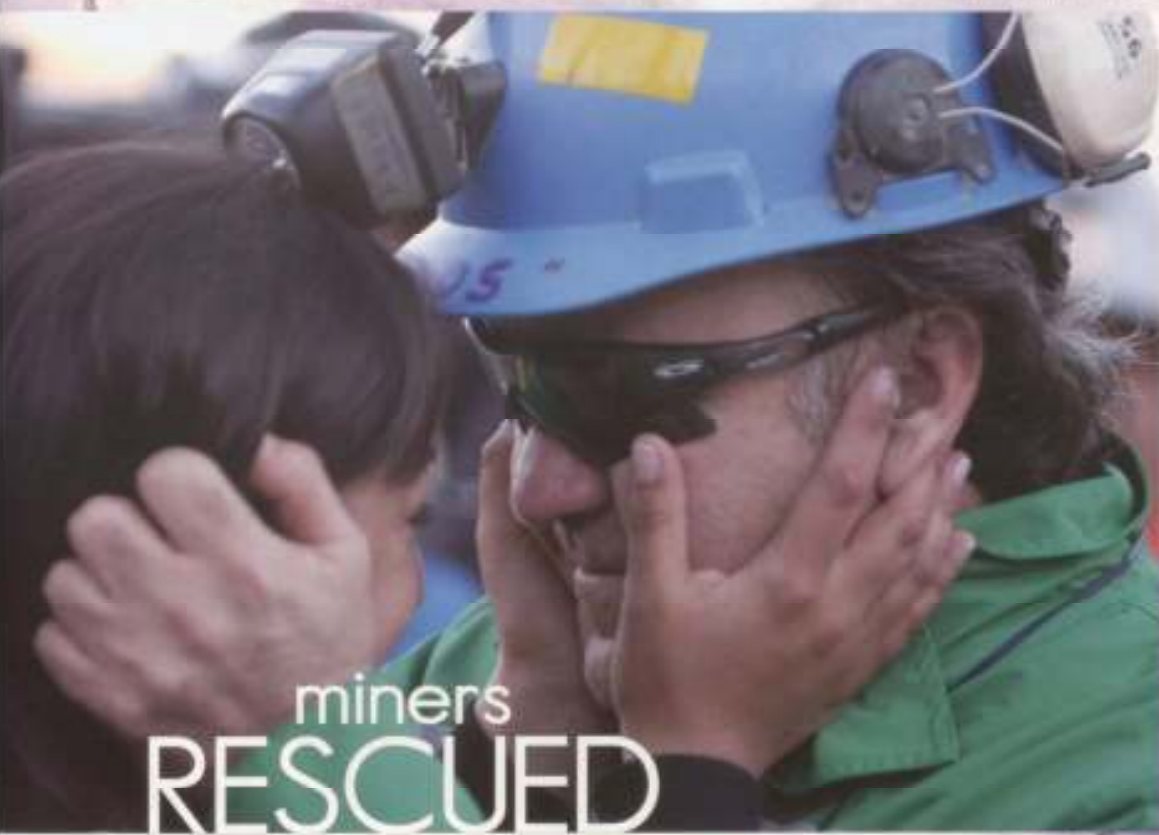
HISTORIC BUZZARD
